- Congrats! If you're reading this, then the directors must have chosen your show to be one of the SOAPs! Make sure that if it's not already a one act, that you cut it down to 30-45 mins.
- During the audition process, make sure you have several people in mind for each character because you can't guarantee you'll get all of the actors you want.
- Collaborate with the stage manager(s) and your possible co-director and get a rehearsal schedule to all of the actors.
- Rehearse!! Do good stuff!!
- Get a set piece and prop list to whoever is in charge of props so they can pull them all for you.
- Also mark all of your sound and light cues in the script and write them on a sheet of paper in order and get it to the stage manager.
- Whatever costume pieces you can't find in the costume storage room, see if your actors can bring them in from home.
- Once you're all set, cruise through rehearsals. (Make sure you set a due date for line memorization!)
- That's it. Perform. It's over, my guy!!
